2025 TMTA EVALUATIONS Saturday, May 10, 2025 University of Arizona

The Arizona Study Program is a twelve year graded course of music study developed by the Arizona State Music Teachers Association to provide for the development of **repertoire**, **technique**, **and theory**. It is organized in terms of the twelve years of public school, with one level available for each of the years a student would be enrolled in school. However, a student may progress at his/her level as the teacher may deem appropriate and/or necessary. It requires continual work throughout the year. In the spring, there is a private evaluation of the repertoire and technique requirements by a Master Adjudicator, and a written theory test.

In addition to a written evaluation of their performance and a grade on their written theory test:

- Certificates and ribbons are awarded to the students to indicate their accomplishment.
- **Plaques** are awarded to those students successfully completing Elementary Division 4A and Intermediate Division 8A in Repertoire, Technique, and Theory.
- Trophies are awarded to students successfully completing the Advanced Division 12A.
- The James Anthony Award (a monetary award) is awarded to high school *seniors* who successfully complete Level 12 A.
- The Arnold Bullock Scholarship of \$400 is available to anyone who receives the James Anthony Award and then becomes a music major at a college or university. Students may apply for the scholarship by writing a letter to the ASP State Chairman stating the name of the institution you are attending, the degree being pursued, and your professional goals upon completion. Documentation must include a transcript showing 12 completed music credits.

- February 15 Student Program Forms for Levels 5-8 & 9-12 due. Send to Marie Sierra. No program forms are required for Levels 1 through 4. Compositions must be in the original key. Arrangements by the composer may be used. For the evaluations, no transcriptions or simplified arrangements are allowed at any level.

All music must be from a **published source.** (See Handbook page for further information.)

- February 15 Enrollment FINAL DEADLINE. No enrollments accepted after this date.
- March 1Send applications for McCurnin Teacher Enrichment and Certification Grants to the ASP
State Chairman, Barbara Russell. Forms are on asmta.org.
- **Mid-March** Instructions for Evaluations (Packet 2) will be sent to teachers enrolled: time block, confidential report form, parent letter, Student Evaluation Forms, and name tags.
- April 1 Level 12 student information due, send to Victoria MacDonald.
- April 10 Return Confidential Report Form to Victoria MacDonald.
- May 14 Pick up evaluation results and awards at Hachenberg Piano after 12:00 p.m.

ENROLLMENT

- **Teachers must purchase a theory workbook for** *each* **student enrolled.** They are copyrighted and may not be reproduced. Proof of purchase may be requested.
- Complete the Enrollment Form (online). Payment is made online. NO REFUNDS OR SUBSTITUTIONS. NEW online enrollment this year! Stay tuned! Webinars in mid-October.
- NEW TEACHER NUMBERS for new online enrollment!
- Indicate previous teacher(s) of all transfer students if students previously participated in ASP.
- Levels may be repeated and/or skipped at the teacher's discretion, however, a student may be evaluated in only one level per school year.
- A student may be enrolled in different levels for 1) theory/technique and 2) repertoire. Theory/ technique must be brought up to the performance level by the third year. Records will show completion of the lower of the two levels. Indicate the different levels on all forms and name tags.
- The performance level will determine the time allotment for evaluation.
- Level 4, 8 and 12 awards are given only for successfully completing Category A. For these awards, repertoire, technique and theory must be at the same level in the same year.
- A Level 12 senior student may take the theory test after February 1. Contact chairman for dates.
- Notify Victoria MacDonald **before February 15** if there are any changes in level, category or enrollment.

See the Teachers Reference Guide 2016 for all repertoire requirements. Indicate dates of obscure composers.

ASP uses the MTNA Composer Classification List found on the MTNA website.

Compositions must be in the original key. Arrangements by the composer may be used. For the evaluations, no transcriptions or simplified arrangements are allowed **at any level**. If an arrangement or a simplification is performed, the teacher will receive a warning letter of the infraction of this policy. The second year this occurs, students of that teacher using arrangements or simplified music will be given a Participant rating.

All music must be from a published source. The teacher will receive a warning letter if music is not from a published source or is obviously reproduced. The second year this occurs, students of that teacher using unauthorized copied music will be given a Participant rating.
