





He will receive a \$200 travel grant from ASMTA to support his participation. MTNA National Competitions will be held on March 15-19, 2025, at the Hilton Minneapolis in Minneapolis, MN.

Also, we welcome Hannah Creviston as co-chair with Yali Luo for the 2025 state competition. We are thrilled to announce that the state competition will be held live at ASU!

The 95th State Conference, "PianoPreneur: Harmonizing Music Education & Business," will take place at Mesa Community College's Performing Arts Center from May 29–31, 2025. Significant progress has been made, and the event promises to offer immense value to members.



Guest artists and presenters include:

- Irina Gorin, who will present on foundational piano teaching and entrepreneurship, conduct a masterclass for beginner and early intermediate students, and adjudicate on May 31st.
- Aviram Reichert, Van Cliburn International Piano Competition bronze medalist, who will offer an interview-style presentation, masterclasses for late intermediate and advanced students, a full recital, and adjudication.
- Connor Chee, commissioned composer who will discuss integrating Navajo music with Western classical traditions and adjudicate on May 31st.

The call for session proposals is open, with six submissions received so far. Early registration and hotel reservations are now available on the website: https://www.asmta.org/events/state-conference/

The conference banquet will be held onstage at the Performing Arts Center, behind the curtains,

accommodating up to 200 guests. Catering and entertainment arrangements are in progress.

Key instrument and donation acquisitions include a Steinway Model D grand piano from Steinway & Sons in Scottsdale for performances and competitions, a Hydrau Hydraulic Bench donated by PianoWorks as a raffle item, and a Clavinova digital piano, tote bags, and lanyards from NextGen Piano.

The conference has secured a \$5,000 grant from The Anna-Maria Moggio Foundation, with approximately \$4,000 remaining for additional programming. Plans are underway to invite an entrepreneurial tax specialist and a marketing expert to lead workshops aimed at helping members grow their businesses.

Volunteer coordination is in progress, with committees being formed to assist with logistics and ensure smooth execution.

The recent EVMTA entrepreneurship workshop was highly successful, drawing 21 attendees and generating interest in the conference's programming.

This conference will provide members with practical tools, inspiration, and networking opportunities to elevate their careers and businesses.

This year marks a milestone for the ASP evaluations as student enrollment and scheduling will be conducted on an online platform using Tenuto Web. In the past, all enrollments and scheduling have been done



manually, at the cost of immeasurable hours and efforts by ASP volunteers each year. It has been

an ongoing goal of the ASP Committee for many vears to put the evaluations into an online enrollment and scheduling process to create a more cohesive, efficient, and professional format for teachers and students. The result will be sustainability of this annual event in a way that utilizes availability technology to further our goals of ASP evaluations for future generations.

The ASP Committee wishes to recognize Susan Traylor, ASP Technology Chair, and ASP volunteers for their efforts and insights to help create an individualized web-based program that fits our needs. The interaction between the web designer of Tenuto Web and our local volunteers is invaluable in creating a program that fits the individual needs of ASP. The ASP Repertoire Guide has been added to the website so that repertoire can be uploaded and approved for levels 5 through 12 online, again reducing the need for volunteers to do this manually. By next year, this option should be available.

The ASP Committee would also like to respectfully recognize and acknowledge the recent passing of Carol Hill, PMTA teacher. We send our condolences to her family and generations of students. Carol is a role model of professionalism, a devoted teacher, a servant in her church, and a pillar in the implementation of ASP as it exists today. She was a contributor to our ASP Theory workbooks and dedicated her beautiful life to the promotion of music education. We extend our respect and love for her efforts to our organization. We thank her for her tireless dedication. She is deeply missed and recognized as an example of professionalism in the field of music education.



The ASMTA Website: Did You Know?

As many of you already know, your "active" (dues are current) membership in ASMTA provides you with several benefits. You likely know about the benefits of participating in ASMTA, such as MTNA competition, James R. Anthony Honors Recital, attending the ASMTA annual conference, participating in the Arizona Study Program (ASP), information for which events/programs can be found on the website. But how much do you know about the following, most of which you can also find on the ASMTA website?

Find-a-Teacher Search:

 Is available to the public. This search allows prospective students to input their address and desired instrument(s), which will retrieve the teachers geographically nearest to the prospective student. Only your name, phone number and email

- address will be retrieved by the Find-a-Teacher search. If you want only your name and email to be retrieved in this search, you can modify that in your member profile of your Dashboard.
- This search also allows searching for teachers with NCTM credentials and/or teachers who participate in the Arizona Study Program (ASP). What you need to know is that, while the NCTM must be added to your website profile by the website manager (because that information comes from MTNA), the ASP designation is not. If you want to be found as an "ASP" participating teacher in the Find-a-Teacher search, you must log into your Dashboard on the ASMTA.org website and place a check in the ASP box.

Member Directory:

- Is for members only. Youn can find it by logging into your Member Dashboard on the ASMTA.org website and selecting Member Directory.
- From your Dashboard, member profile, you can choose how much (or little) information you wish to show in the Member Directory
- You can print out the Member Directory to hard copy or to PDF and save on your computer or phone.
- You can even filter the directory by your local association (e.g., PMTA or CMTA or NAMTA, etc.).

Arizona Study Program (ASP):

- ASP Technique Videos on your Member Dashboard. These videos are available for all ASMTA members, not just those who participate in ASP.
- You no longer need to log into the ASMTA website dashboard to enroll students in the Arizona Study Program (ASP) because ASP Enrollments now go through the Tenuto Web app. Although you may go directly to ASP's Tenuto Website, if you would like to read instructions about how to obtain your login, how to enter registrations and more, you should begin by going to the Arizona Study Program page of the ASMTA.org website, scroll down to Enrollment information and read carefully.

Keep in mind, your Member Profile Information is manually downloaded weekly or bi-weekly from MTNA's membership records, then manually entered into the ASMTA website member database. This "manual" process is why you can pay your dues at MTNA, but your ASMTA website profile is not activated immediately. Also, your username and password are not the same as your MTNA credentials. These are questions I frequently answer.

If you have any questions about the ASMTA.org website, how to log into your Dashboard, or how to edit your profile, let me know.

Adult Recital Chair, Claire Gordon, will host another Recital at her home on March 8, 2025.


Performance Plus Co-Chairs Camile Conforti and Rosemary Stelmack planned their event for March 6 at Rosmary Stelmack's home.
